## Pursuit Analysis:

# First Quarter 2012



Captain Harris,

I reviewed the pursuit stats for the First Quarter of 2012. As expected, and conforming to known trends, First Shift is involved in the majority of the pursuits for our Department (15 for the First Quarter). They accounted for (68%) of the First Quarter 2012 pursuits.

Second shift accounted for 5% (1) of the First Quarter 2012 total.

Third shift has accounted for 18% (4) of the First Quarter 2012 total.

TAC squad has accounted for 9% (2) of the First Quarter 2012 total.

There were (2) accidents during pursuits in the First Quarter of 2012. This accounted for (9%) of the pursuits.

The longest pursuit in the First Quarter 2012 lasted **10 minutes** (5%). Five pursuits lasted 0-1 minute (23%). Six pursuits lasted 2 minutes (27%). Six pursuits lasted for 3-5 minutes (27%); and there were four pursuits in the 6-9 minute range (18%).

During the First Quarter of 2012, Traffic was given (64%) of the time as a reason to pursue. Felony suspects were given (18%) of the time as a reason to pursue. Misdemeanor suspects were given (9%) of the time as a reason to pursue; and Suspicion was give (9%) of the time as reason to pursue. For the First Quarter 2012, Traffic and Felony accounted for a combined (82%) as a reason to pursue.

During the First Quarter of 2012, pursuits were allowed to continue (74%) of the time as compared to (57%) of the time for the First Quarter 2011. This is an **increase of (17%)** from this same time frame last year. Supervisors terminated pursuits (13%) of the time as compared to (14%) of the time in 2011. This is a **comparable figure** in the cancelling of pursuits by supervisors. Officers terminated the pursuits (13%) of the time in the First Quarter 2012. This is a decrease in percentages from the First Quarter 2011 statistics where officers terminated (29%) of pursuits.

There were (4) incidents of spike deployment this Quarter. This is up (84%) from the First Quarter 2011.

Arrests were made in (86%) of the First Quarter 2012 pursuits. This reflects a (15%) increase as compared to the First Quarter of 2011 where an arrest was made in (71%) of the pursuits.



#### **First Quarter 2012 / An Overview:**


- There were 22 pursuits during the First Quarter of 2012. This number compares to 7 in the First Quarter of 2011.
- The overall trend for First Quarter pursuits (22) is higher compared to the previous five-year First Quarter average of 13 pursuits.
- The percentage of First Quarter arrests made after pursuits **increased** by 15%. **Felony pursuits increased by 18% as a reason to pursue** from the First Quarter 2011.
- Discipline occurred in **32%** (7) of the pursuits as compared to **29%** (2) from the First Quarter 2011. Discipline in the First Quarter 2012 was limited to counseling (6) and suspension (1). In the First Quarter 2011, discipline consisted of counseling only (2).
- 19 suspects were identified out of 22 pursuits.
- 30 different officers were involved with pursuits in the First Quarter 2012. The statistics of those officer's historical involvements in pursuits as a primary or secondary officer are: 21 have 1-5 pursuits, 5 have 6-10 pursuits, and 4 have had 11 or more pursuits since employment.






#### **Officers with 2 or more pursuits:**


Four officers had more than a single pursuit the First Quarter 2012:







#### **Reason Initiated First Quarter 2012**




#### **Reason Initiated First Quarter 2011**









Pursuits Times 1st Quarter 2012

Pursuits Times 1st Quarter 2011




Longest Pursuit Durations for the Quarter compared to the Longest Pursuit for that Year






**Time Percentages for Firtst Quarter 2012** 



■ 0 - 1 minute ■ 2 minutes ■ 3 to 5 minutes ■ 6 to 9 minutes ■ 10 plus













#### **Arrest Made First Quarter 2012**




#### **Arrest Made First Quarter 2011**



### AMARILLO POLICE DEPARTMENT PURSUIT ANALYSIS 15 Pursuits Where Disciplinary Action Recommended:

During the First Quarter of 2012, counseling discipline was recommended in (6) or 27% of the pursuits. This is **lower** compared to the First Quarter 2011. In (15), or 68% of the time, no discipline was recommended. This is **lower** compared to the First Quarter 2011. There was (0) 0% incidents of "Training Non-Discipline" this Quarter as compared to (0) 0% incidents in the First Quarter 2011. There was (0) 0% incident of "Remedial" training in the First Quarter as compared to (0) 0% incidents in the First Quarter 2011. There was (0) 0% incidents of "Remedial" training in the First Quarter (5%) compared to (0) in the First Quarter 2011.
