The Texas Police Chiefs Association's (TPCA) Officer Safety Committee VINCIBLE Program in partnership with the TMLIRP will be providing a Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC) course in Edinburg on Friday, March 1<sup>st</sup>, from 8a to 5p. The course fee is \$100, which covers the cost of a fully-equipped Individual First Aid Kit (IFAK).

The class is limited to 30 officers. Each officer successfully completing the course will be issued a fully outfitted Individual First Aid Kit (IFAK) that includes chest seals. Officers will receive 8 hours TCOLE credit for successfully completing the course.

Topics covered during the training include:

- Understanding VINCIBLE and how to access resources/training
- Two Phases of Care: Direct and Indirect Threat
- Tourniquet nomenclature and usage; chest seal familiarity and usage
- Bleeding, Airway, Tension Pneumothorax and Hypothermia (BATH) assessments
- Junctional injury interventions with application
- The role of TECC in active attack, with ICS overview
- Comprehensive assessment

The class will include practical exercises that are rooted in VINCIBLE cornerstones and will be "handson."
