The members of the TBFAA provide products and services that enhance public safety in every community in the state. We share a common mission with public safety officials to improve the quality of life for every citizen in the State of Texas.

One of the unique aspects of our scholarship program is the requirement for each applicant to submit an essay about how their parent or guardian helps secure their community. This essay is judged on grammar and content and reinforces the important role that law enforcement and fire service personnel play in our community.

Rules and Eligibility Requirements

The TBFAA Youth Scholarship Program was created to promote goodwill between the Burglar and Fire Alarm Industry and first responders as part of our ongoing partnership with police and fire officials. The program provides cash scholarship awards to their deserving sons or daughters who are attending a college or university. The first-place winner is selected from the applicants and receives an award of \$2,000. The student must be at least 15 years of age and not older than 20. He or she must be a graduating senior (in the 2024 – 2025 school year) who will receive a diploma from an accredited high school, located within the state. He or she must be accepted for admission to an accredited college or university in the fall of 2025.

Each eligible student must have a father, mother or legal guardian who is a full-time active-duty employee, and not on disability. The parent or guardian must be a member of a law enforcement agency or a full-time paid or volunteer member of a fire department located in the State of Texas.

Each student must submit a completed and signed application. Failure to follow instructions can result in disqualification.

Students must submit:

- Proof of enrollment in high school via an official transcript.
- Proof of acceptance to a college or university (letter acceptable)
- Proof of parent's occupation (ID or supervisory letter acceptable)
- Essay (typed) (Place name on each page)
- Letter of recommendation from counselor, teacher, or other agency regarding extracurricular activities

Awards are based on a combination of academic achievement, national test scores, extracurricular activities, and essays. All decisions are final. All materials become property of the TBFAA. Submission is permission to publish all essays.

Criteria for Awards

The TBFAA Youth Scholarship Program awards will be given based on the criteria noted below.

- 1. Grade Average
- 2. Essay

20 points 60 points <u>20 points</u>

3. Extracurricular activities 20 points Total 100 points

Be sure to include specific examples of how decisions you have made in your life reflect the example your parent has set.
